

Andy Warhol (1928-1987) was a Pop Artist who was famous for his Soup Cans and brightly colored prints of celebrities. Warhol used images from everyday pop culture (magazines, newspapers, etc.) for his screen-printed images. He also made his own photographs, films, sculptures, and installation pieces. Third grade students learned about his art making process, the meaning behind the Pop Art movement, and Andy Warhol's use of repetition and color before creating their own Pop Art-inspired portraits. Each year, the third grade students take a field trip to the Cincinnati Art Museum, where they get to see Cincinnati's original Warhol: Pete Rose.
